Impact to date 14/15 cohort

The Raise on Line data shows that in the KS1 phonics screening our disadvantaged pupils are in line with their non disadvantaged peers and significantly above the averages for both disadvantaged and non disadvantaged pupils nationally.

The attainment of KS1 disadvantaged pupils is broadly in line with their non disadvantaged peers and above the average point scores of disadvantaged pupils nationally.

At KS2 the progress of our disadvantaged pupils matches and exceeds the progress of our non disadvantaged pupils in writing and maths and also exceeds the national average for expected progress in these subjects. In reading the disadvantaged pupils are in line with disadvantaged pupils nationally.

The percentage of our disadvantaged pupils attaining a level 4 or above is in line with their non disadvantaged peers and the gaps between them have narrowed in comparison with last year's Raise on Line. (See impact statement) Whilst our Disadvantaged pupils are above the averages for National Disadvantaged they are still slightly below National in maths and reading and this is where we aim to continue improving.
