

Pupil Premium Impact statement 2014/15

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) for the financial year 2014/15 was £196,680.

The within school gap between PPG and non PPG has decreased in all subjects compared to last year's Raise on Line Data.

This means that 2 years ago PPG pupils were, on average, two and a half to four terms behind their peers. In reading this gap has reduced significantly to less than half a term. In writing and maths the gap has reduced by 75% or more meaning PPG pupils are less than a term behind their non PPG peers. £47,000 has provided an Accelerated Learning Teachers (ALT) for each Key Stage. An experienced, qualified teacher who works across classes within year groups to provide additional support and intervention when needed to targeted pupils.

£54,200 was allocated to increase Small group tuition by a qualified teacher in years 2, 5 and 6. This has been closely monitored by the PPG Coordinator and the progress rate, measured by Average Point Score (APS) of all children in Intervention Groups has been higher than the APS of pupils who did not receive intervention.

£12,000 provided targeted pupils with after school teaching sessions and Easter Holiday revision sessions for Year 6.

A proportion of our learning mentor's salary is paid by the PP grant meaning that PPG pupils at risk of emotional or behaviour disorders are quickly targeted and taught self regulation strategies which encourage learners to plan, monitor and evaluate their learning. Some PPG pupils have received the support of a Relateen Counsellor; this has resulted in timely, appropriate support for children when it is most needed.

The continued employment of an Education Welfare Officer in school means that PPG pupils' attendance is closely monitored and addressed quickly to ensure that attendance increases helping to narrow the attainment gap between PPG pupils and non PPG.

Outdoor learning costs, residential visits and educational visits are all subsidised for PPG pupils meaning that they fully engage with all aspects of school life and the different approaches to learning.
