Students will be exploring Wellington in order to inform their writing. The final product will be a town trail outlining the places of interest in Wellington for children. We hope to publish this trail on our website and in the Wellington community.

Swimming
Athletics: Focusing on developing our skills in throwing, running and jumping in preparation for Sports Day.

Striking and Fielding looking to improve our skills in cricket and rounders:

Science

Understanding the life cycle of animals, including humans and then comparing the life cycle of humans to other living things, such as trees.

Mathematics

Understanding place value in comparing and ordering very large or small numbers. Numerical patterns: What relationships can we find within numbers?

- Re-capping our knowledge of written methods for the four operations.
- Mental strategies.
